

Science	Lever and fulcrum.	<p>Small world pg 91.</p>  <p>Lever and Fulcrum</p> <p>A lever is a simple machine that makes work easier for us. It involves moving a load around a balance point (fulcrum) by using a force. Many of our basic tools, such as scissors, pliers, hammers, nutcrackers and tongs, use levers. When you sit on one end of a seesaw, the other side goes up. This is the basic idea of a lever. When you push or pull one part of a lever, you also push or pull the other part in the opposite direction. This is another one of Newton's laws.</p> <p>Investigate: What Is a Fulcrum?</p> <p>You will need: Ruler, pocket dictionary</p> <p>Method:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Place the ruler on your desk, with part of it hanging over the edge. 2. Place the pocket dictionary on the part of the ruler that is on your desk. 3. Lift the dictionary by pressing down on the part of the ruler that is hanging out. Is it easier to lift the book by pressing on the very end of the ruler or the part that is nearer to the edge of the table? The ruler in this case is a lever and the edge of the table is the fulcrum. The book that must be lifted is called the load. 		Yes



Levers are simple machines that make work easier for us. Many levers are used in everyday life. The trolley above is a lever.

A door hinge is a lever. It makes it possible to open and close a door.

A door handle is a lever. How many other levers can you find in school or at home?

A hammer is a simple machine that uses the idea of the lever to increase the force on a nail. You can use the claw of the hammer to pull the nail out again. The handle is the lever and the claw is the balance point (fulcrum).



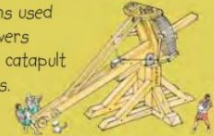

The work that you submit may be drawn or painted in pencil, charcoal, pen and ink, crayon, markers, pastel, watercolour, gouache, acrylics, oils, poster colour and collage. Alternatively, it may be a print created from a lino block, wood block or any other method, and your artwork may be submitted on canvas.</p> <p>Only digitally produced works using any artwork software may be submitted to the Competition by email at texacochildrensart@valero.com. A photograph or scanned image of an original artwork will not be considered under any circumstances.</p> <p>Originality</p> <p>Your work should be original and unaided. Please do not copy another person's work. Any source imagery must be indicated at time of entry. Failure to properly reference any source imagery may result in disqualification.</p> <p>Number of Entries</p> <p>You may submit up to two entries per individual but each entry must have its own completed Application Form securely attached to it. Only individual entries will be accepted and they may be submitted directly by you, by your school or by your art group.</p> <p>Information Required</p> <p>If you are submitting artwork to the Competition that has been undertaken in your home, you must complete a Home Application Form.</p> <p>Your parent, guardian must sign and date the Application Form and it must be securely attached to your artwork. This requirement is in place for data protection compliance reasons.</p>
