Recipe For A Class Outing

Ingredients:

- 30 children, washed and scrubbed
- 29 packed lunches (no bottles)

Method:



Science Experiment




Method

1. Rub your hands over a slice of bread.
2. Put it in a plastic bag and label with your name and 'Unwashed'. Seal the back with sticky tape.
3. Wash your hands with soap and water.
4. Rub your hands on another slice of bread.
5. Put it in a plastic bag and label with your name and 'Washed'. Seal the back with sticky tape.
6. Keep both bags in a warm place. Check them daily, but **do not** open the bags.

You will need:

- 2 slices of bread per child
- 2 grip lock plastic bags per child
- Soap
- Sticky labels
- Sticky tape



English	Food Challenge!	<p>Porridge Bread is delicious, if you haven't tried it do not worry, you are about to!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C/160°C fan/ gas mark 4. Grease a standard 900g loaf tin and line it with parchment paper. Place the yoghurt, egg, milk and bicarbonate of soda in a mixing bowl. 2. Whisk together until well combined. 3. Add the porridge oats, salt and nuts and seeds (if using). 4. Stir until the batter is well blended. 5. Scrape the batter into the loaf tin. Cut a line down the centre of your loaf and sprinkle with some extra nuts or seeds, if you like. 6. Place in the oven and bake for 45-55 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. 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Christy Moore - An Irish Folk Legend



Christopher Andrew Moore, better known as Christy, was born on 7 May 1945 in Newbridge, Co. Kildare. Christy is one of Ireland's best known and loved folk singers. He is also a well renowned songwriter and guitarist. His younger brother is also a musician, who uses the stage name Luka Bloom.

Christy's musical career began as a solo artist in 1972, however he was also a founding member and lead singer of the successful bands Planxty and Moving Hearts for periods of the 1970s and early 1980s. Christy has reformed with his old bandmates on many occasions for special performances and he is a great supporter of other musicians and songwriters.

Christy is best known for his ability to capture a sense of 'Irishness' in his song writing. His cleverly written lyrics often provide social commentary. This means he talks about important issues that are facing the country or the world at the time. By talking about these matters he is highlighting their importance and this can help to bring about change. Many artists use their influence to talk about the issues that are important to them. Christy is known to cover a range of topics such as politics, history, religion and Irish culture.

Christy released the album 'Ordinary Man' in 1985. His tenth studio album, it is a fine example of social commentary of that time. The title song reflected the plight of the ordinary working man in Ireland during the mid-1980s - a time of financial recession and hardship for many people. In the song, Christy has lost his job and he laments that while he and others like him are struggling,

the wealthy continue to live comfortable, undisrupted lives. Much of Christy's success comes from his ability to write about issues facing the Irish people and to give the ordinary people, who are often unheard, a voice.

The original 'Ordinary Man' album featured a song called 'They Never Came Home', which Christy wrote for the victims and families of a devastating fire in the North Dublin 'Stardust' nightclub in 1981. Forty-eight young people lost their lives in the tragedy. Christy has always used his music as a way to share his opinions. In the song, he criticized the government and the nightclub for the tragedy. The song was ordered to be removed from the album by court order. Christy, however, continues to be a controversial social commentator.



Christy Moore - An Irish Folk Legend

Christy is a versatile musician who is as much associated with clever, witty lyrics as he is with delicate, sombre ballads. One of his best known songs, entitled 'Lisdoonvarna' is a comical tribute to this town in County Clare and the former music festival that was held there. 'My Little Honda 50' is a lighthearted song about the popular motorbike and 'Don't Forget Your Shovel' is a witty and up-tempo song



dedicated to the Irishmen who worked on building the railway system in the United Kingdom. His song 'Joxer Goes To Stuttgart' is a hilarious tale about an Irish soccer fan's adventures at the Euros in Germany in 1988. While humour is often present in Christy's songs, they continue to represent parts of everyday Irish life at particular moments in time.

Christy Moore has managed to transcend the folk music genre and is often credited with modernising Irish traditional music so that it is

appreciated across generations. Many modern singers and songwriters cite Christy as an influential figure in their musical careers, such as U2, Sinéad O'Connor and Ed Sheeran. In 2007, Christy was named Ireland's Greatest Living Musician in the RTÉ People of the Year Awards.

In July 2011, Christy performed his song 'Ride On' on stage with Coldplay at the Oxegen music festival. This was a special moment for Christy, as he performed to 60,000 young festival goers at a venue just a few miles from where he grew up in Kildare. At one of his many appearances on The Late Late Show, Christy revealed that Ed Sheeran visited his house ahead of his Croke Park gig in 2015 and Christy taught him the song 'Molly Malone', which Ed performed on stage later that evening to a sell-out crowd. In return for the tutorial, Ed surprised Christy with a gift of a specially made guitar. Christy Moore continues to tour, perform and delight audiences all over Ireland and the world. His music captures stories of what it means to be Irish, in good times, bad times and everything in between.






