

How to Make a Milkshake

Ingredients:

- milk
- vanilla ice-cream
- fruit (optional)
- milkshake flavouring (chocolate, strawberry or banana)

Equipment:

- ice-cream scoop
- blender
- Cup
- Straw

Method:

- 1. First, pour some milk into the blender.
- 2. Next, put one scoop of vanilla ice-cream into the blender.
- 3. Then, pour some milkshake flavouring into the blender.
- 4. Afterwards, add some chopped up fruit to the mixture.
- 5. Turn on the blender gently, once the milkshake is smooth, turn off the blender.
- 6. Pour the milkshake into a cup.
- 7. Finally, drink your milkshake with a straw. Enjoy!

What you need:
