How to Build a Sandcastle?

Aim: Follow these instructions to build a sandcastle.

Materials and Equipment:

- Bucket
- Spade
- · Sand (not too dry, needs to be a little bit wet)
- · Shells, Seaweed

Steps:

- 1. Lastly, put the seaweed and shells to decorate the sandcastle however you like.
- 2. Next, quickly turn the bucket upside down, try not to spill any sand out of the bucket as you do this.
- 3. Then, pat down the sand so that the bucket is nice and full and smooth on top.
- 4. To begin, fill your bucket to the top with sand.
- 5. Afterwards, gently tap the bucket before carefully pulling it upwards, off the sandcastle.
