Bank Holiday Monday.

Enjoy your day and have a lovely week.

Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup>

Rhyming revision: Read the story Mox's Shop and complete the -ot and -og activities. Read the story Gus the Duck and complete the -ug and short vowel activities on [www.starfall.com/h/index.php](http://www.starfall.com/h/index.php) Click on grades 123 and go to Learn to Read.

Write a list of -ot -og and -ug rhyming words on a page and draw pictures to go with them.

Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup>

Play the high frequency word Bingo game Phase 3 and Phase 4 on [www.ictgames.com](http://www.ictgames.com)

Play the Help a Hedgehog game Phase 3 ccvc/cvcc words and Phase 3 mixed vowel phonemes on [www.ictgames.com](http://www.ictgames.com)

Writing: Write 6/7 sentences about What you did today and read the story aloud for your family.

Thursday 7<sup>th</sup>

Reading: [www.oxfordowl.co.uk](http://www.oxfordowl.co.uk) Parents register for free. Choose the book Stuck in the mud from The Oxford Reading Tree. Talk about the pictures. Listen to the story being read. Read the story. Answer comprehension questions based on the story.

Draw pictures and write the words under them to make compound words. Write them as word sums:

1) Butter+fly = Butterfly e.g. draw some butter +draw a fly= draw a butterfly.

2) Lip+stick= Lipstick e.g. draw a lip+ draw a stick= draw a lipstick.

3) Rain+bow= Rainbow

4) Lady+bird=Ladybird

Draw pictures and write words under them to make compound words. Write them as word sums:

Read and choose 8 words from the following list of tricky words and put each one in a sentence. Write the 8 sentences.

Monday 4th

Enjoy your day and have a lovely week.

Tuesday 5th

Using a hundred square: Count to 100. Count in 2's to 100. Count in 5's to 100. Count in 10's to 100. Count back in 10's from 100.

Guess the number game: Choose a number on the hundred square and give your child clues to find the number. E.g. The number before it is 15. The number after it is 17. The number above it is 6 and the number below it is 26. What is the number? The answer is 16. Choose 6 different numbers for your child to guess.

Ask your child simple take away sums to 20 using the hundred square. E.g.  $7-6=1$

$19-4=15$

Ask your child some simple take away word problem sums using the hundred square e.g. I had 8 sweets and I gave 4 of them to my friend. How many sweets did I have left?

Play the +5 +6 and +7 addition balloon pop games on [www.theschoolhub.ie/sample.php](http://www.theschoolhub.ie/sample.php)

Using a deck of cards 2-10: Take out all the aces, kings, queens, jacks and jokers you won't need these for the game. You will need 2 players for this game.

Split the cards into 2 equal bundles. You have one bundle and your child has the other bundle. Take the first card off the top of the bundles each time. Look at the values of the cards. Whoever has the higher number gets to keep it each time. Whoever has the most cards when the bundles run out wins.

Wednesday 6th

Using a hundred square: Count to 100. Count in 2's to 100. Count in 5's to 100. Count in 10's to 100. Count back in 10's from 100.

Guess the number game: Choose a number on the hundred square and give your child clues to find the number. E.g. The number before it is 24. The number after it is 26. The number above it is 15 and the number below it is 35. What is the number? The answer is 25. Choose 6 different numbers for your child to guess.

Ask your child simple take away sums to 20 using the hundred square.

Ask your child some simple take away word problem sums using the hundred square e.g. I had 10 bananas and I gave 5 of them to my sister. How many bananas did I have left?

Make some patterns: For this you will need 3 lego blocks. 1 green, 1 blue and 1 red.

See how many patterns you can make using the 3 blocks by stacking them. E.g. red, green, blue. Red, blue, green. Green, red, blue. Blue, green, red. Green, blue, red. Blue, red, green.

Your child draws out each stack and colours it using the 3 colours green, blue and red after she makes it to record the patterns she has made.

Thursday 7th

Using a hundred square: Count to 100. Count in 2's to 100. Count in 5's to 100. Count in 10's to 100. Count back in 10's from 100.

Guess the number game: Choose a number on the hundred square and give your child clues to find the number. E.g. The number before it is 77. The number after it is 79. The number above it is 68 and the

number below it is 88. What is the number? The answer is 78. Choose 6 different numbers for your child to guess.

Ask your child simple take away sums to 20 using the hundred square.

Ask your child some simple take away word problem sums using the hundred square e.g. I had 12 cakes and I gave 6 of them to my brother. How many cakes did I have left?

Bingo game: Draw out 2 tables with 8 boxes on 2 sheets of paper. You and your child choose any 8 numbers to fill out the boxes between 1 and 20. Write out the numbers 1-20 on pieces of paper. Call out each number and cover the numbers with pieces of paper/counters. Take turns at calling out the numbers.

### Friday 8<sup>th</sup>

Using a hundred square: Count to 100. Count in 2's to 100. Count in 5's to 100. Count in 10's to 100. Count back in 10's from 100.

Guess the number game: Choose a number on the hundred square and give your child clues to find the number. E.g. The number before it is 11. The number after it is 13. The number above it is 2 and the number below it is 22. What is the number? The answer is 12. Choose 6 different numbers for your child to guess.

Ask your child simple take away sums to 20 using the hundred square.

Heavy and Light: Find 5 heavy things and 5 light things around the house. Draw the heavy things and draw the light things.
