Where is Hot and Where is Not?

The Sun heats some parts of Earth more than other parts. Parts near the middle get the most heat. Here, the land can turn into **desert**.

Parts near the top and bottom of Earth get the **least** heat. Here, the ground is covered in snow and ice.

There is very little water in the desert. It is **difficult** to live there.

Creatures that live in the desert have special **abilities**.

Camels can go without water for more than a month! The desert fox has enormous ears which help it to cool off.

Plants that live in the desert are special too. A **cactus** uses very little water. It does not waste a drop!

It is very cold at the **South Pole**. In winter, it is colder than a freezer! A cup of water would freeze in a few minutes.

Creatures that live here are special too. **Seals** have lots of fat under their skin, which keeps them warm.

Penguins huddle together. This keeps them cosy.

Very few plants can live at the South Pole. It is too cold.

If you ever go to the South Pole, wear your warmest clothes!
