

• Skeletons

One thing that is the same about all of these people is that they have skeletons. The bones in our skeletons keep us firm. Without them we would be floppy and soft. Look at the picture of this skeleton and answer the questions below in your copy.

• Bones

Bones are alive! If they were not, they would not mend if you broke one. When you were born you had about 300 bones. These bones were a bit soft. As you get older, your bones grow into each other and get harder. When you are fully grown you will have 206 bones. Your adult bones will be much harder on the outside, but the inside will still be soft like jelly.

6 - My Skeleton and Muscles

• Muscles


Bones cannot move by themselves. They need muscles to help them. You have 650 muscles in your body to help you run, jump, carry things and smile. A muscle is like a piece of elastic that is attached to your bones. When you want to move any part of your body, a muscle gets shorter and pulls on the bone.

• Pairs of Muscles

Muscles always work in pairs. Stretch out your arm to one side and put your other hand on your upper arm muscle. Now bend your arm. Can you feel the muscle move? Now put your hand underneath your upper arm and straighten it. This is the muscle that pulls your arm down. Check out your leg muscles in the same way.
