## 36 – Rivers of Ireland



### • From Stream to Sea

Every river begins its life as a small stream in the mountains. As it flows down the mountainside other streams join it and it gets bigger. By the time they reach the sea most rivers move slowly and carry lots of water. Ireland has hundreds of rivers. The longest river is the river Shannon. The longest river in the world is the river Nile in Africa which is 6,700 kilometres long. The river Amazon in South America carries more water than any other river in the world.





### River Activities

There are lots of activities that can be enjoyed on rivers such as boating and fishing, swimming and rafting. Ireland has some of the finest fishing rivers in Europe and people from all over the world come here to fish. Can you name three types of fish they might catch?

Rivers can be dangerous. Never go swimming in a river unless an adult is with you. Dangerous currents can carry you away from the bank. Most big cities in the world are built on rivers.

Rivers are also important because they supply fresh water to towns and cities. Long ago they were used to turn machines in mills and factories. Today rivers are used to make electricity.



### The Water Cycle

A cycle is something that goes on and on. Water from rivers and streams flows into seas and oceans. Some of this water evaporates and is carried as clouds by the wind back over land. It falls to the ground as rain and runs back into the rivers and streams. This is called the water cycle.
